

Distance between fireproof cable trays and ordinary cable trays



Overview

This design note adopts a 300 mm horizontal air-gap separation between primary and secondary life-safety trays on roofs, based on these regulatory requirements and established UK guidance. BS 7671:2018 +A2:2022 states: "Circuits of safety services shall be independent of other. Cable tray installation must comply with specific technical standards to ensure electrical safety, system reliability, and long-term maintainability. Where cables pass through shafts, walls, slabs, or enter electrical panels or cabinets, openings shall be tightly sealed with firestopping materials in accordance with.
